The Age of Silver. Mines, society and powers in medieval South France

Abstract:

At about the Year 1000, a large mining boom affected most of the European mountains. Argentiferous deposits were among the most sought after in a context of fragmentation of powers and economic growth. The massifs of southern France were one of the centers of this productive dynamism. In three centuries, their deposits were extensively prospected and exploited with certain efficiency. How did the actors of production organize their work? What links did they have with the powers? What spaces did the mining production shape and according to which rhythms? By providing answers to these questions through the joint study of texts and archaeological remains, we contribute to informing the functioning of mining production as that of medieval societies.

Dr. Nicolas Minvielle Larousse

Historian and archaeologist specializing in the Middle Ages. He has prepared from 2012 to 2017 a doctoral thesis on the exploitation of silver mines of medieval Languedoc, teaching at Aix-Marseille University as assistant lecturer. His work concerns problems of history and archeology of techniques from mining areas in the south of France and the Mediterranean basin.

Associate member of the Laboratory of Medieval and Modern Archeology in the Mediterranean (LA3M, AMU-CNRS, UMR 7298), member of the French Archaeological Society for the Study of Mines and Metallurgy (SAFEMM) and member of the Old Mines Study Group (GEMA).
