Abstract:

During the last two decades several new discoveries in Greece, Turkey, Bulgaria, and Russia, as well as new publications of earlier finds, which were hitherto inaccessible to scholars, have shed new light on the Greek and related toreutics from the Archaic through the Hellenistic periods. A choice of new and exceptional bronze, silver, and gold vases will serve as *Ariadne's thread* in the labyrinth of technological advances, banquet customs, religious beliefs, intercultural relations, and political priorities, which shaped the luxury creations of the most unjustly neglected field of Greek art.

Dr. Athanasios Sideris

(*University of the Aegean / Charles University*)

Visiting professor, Dr. Athanasios Sideris is a Classical archaeologist who studied in Prague, Paris, and Dijon. His field of interests encompasses the Greek and related toreutics, the economy and ecology of the Classical world, Phokis, and the modern reception of Antiquity. He was the Director of the Department of History and Archaeology in the Foundation of the Hellenic World in Athens. He directed the excavations in Halka Bunar, Bulgaria, and led a survey in northern Iraq. Sideris is currently the Director of the Kastrouli excavations, near Delphi. He is an affiliated member of the Institute of Classical Archaeology, Prague, a member of the Archaeometry Laboratory, University of the Aegean, Rhodes, and the Head Curator of Thrace Foundation in Sofia.
